## ***Quarter Ended 30 September 2023 -79% Reduction in Operating Cash Outflow***

Fatfish Group Ltd ("**Fatfish**" or the "**Company**") is pleased to provide the quarterly summary of its activities for the quarter ended 30 September 2023 ("**Quarter**").

During the Quarter, Fatfish experienced a slight decrease in cash receipts, with a total of cash receipt of A\$0.7 million, compared to A\$1.0 million in the preceding quarter. Despite this, we are pleased to report that diligent efforts have been made to enhance the efficiency of our operating activities. As a result, net cash utilised in operating activities was notably reduced to A\$95,000, representing a significant **79% reduction** from the A\$450,000 recorded in the previous quarter.

Management remains steadfast in its commitment to fostering high-quality revenue streams and has been actively engaged in the implementation of cost review measures aimed at achieving profitability.

### **Business Overview**

The company's fintech business held via Asean Fintech Group continues to see growth in its payment gateway business which saw A\$665 million worth of transactions transacted during the Quarter.

Carewise - a new healthcare digital insurance product launched by the Asean Fintech Group receives endorsement from its partnered insurance provider and regulators and is soft-launched during the Quarter.

Fatberry has introduced new general insurance products during the Quarter and automated many of its inbound enquiry using AI technology.

In addition, the Group has formed an AI Incubation Team within the Group to explore and incubate potential businesses using AI technologies.

The Company entered into a definitive legally binding agreement with US based Arena Investors, LP for the issuance of up to \$8 million convertible notes. Salient terms of the Notes are as follows:

(i) To be drawn 1 tranche;

(ii) Investor may elect to convert the Notes at any time up to the Maturity Date, at a conversion price of \$0.07 per Note.

(iii) Maturity date is 12 months from date of issue of the tranche, which shall be extendable upon mutual agreement of the parties, after which the Company shall redeem the relevant Notes in cash, provided that they have not been converted into shares by the Investor; and

(iv) Coupon rate of 1.0% per annum.
