# Wallis Lake Food Safety Management Plan Update

East 33 Limited (ASX: **E33**) ("**East 33**" or "**Company**") provides an update further to the announcement on 9 November 2023 with regards to the closure of Cape Hawke, Long Island and Wallis Lake Harvest Areas. The Wallis Lake Shellfish Program and the NSW Food Authority have confirmed on 11<sup>th</sup> December that these areas are safe and open for harvest and the Company has reopened its operations at Wallis Lake.

The Company confirms that during the closure of Wallis Lake it successfully utilised stock from Port Stephens to enable farm oyster sales to continue in the lead-up to the busy Christmas period.

East 33 is pleased that this re-opening will also help underpin Sydney Rock Oyster supply to our distribution business to help satisfy customer demand over summer.
