2. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as a **non-binding resolution**:

“That, for the purposes of section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, approval is given for the adoption of the Remuneration Report as contained in the Company's annual financial report for the financial year ended 30 June 2024.”

Note: the vote on this Resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company.

3. RESOLUTION 2 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – GERD HOENICKE

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

“That, for the purpose of clause 14.2 of the Constitution, Listing Rule 14.5 and for all other purposes, Gerd Hoenicke, a Director, retires by rotation, and being eligible, is re-elected as a Director.”

4. RESOLUTION 3 – RATIFICATION OF PRIOR ISSUE OF CONSULTANCY SHARES

- a Shareholder who is entitled to cast two or more votes may appoint two proxies and may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise. If the Shareholder appoints two proxies and the appointment does not specify the proportion or number of the member's votes, then in accordance with section 249X(3) of the Corporations Act, each proxy may exercise one-half of the votes.

Shareholders and their proxies should be aware that:

- if proxy holders vote, they must cast all directed proxies as directed; and
- any directed proxies which are not voted will automatically default to the Chair, who must vote the proxies as directed.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared to provide information which the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass the Resolutions.

1. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

In accordance with the Corporations Act, the business of the Meeting will include receipt and consideration of the annual financial report of the Company for the financial year ended 30 June 2024 together with the declaration of the Directors, the Directors' report, the Remuneration Report and the auditor's report.

The Company will not provide a hard copy of the Company's annual financial report to Shareholders unless specifically requested to do so. The Company's annual financial report is available on its website at www.clearvuepv.com.

2. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

2.1 General

The Corporations Act requires that at a listed company's annual general meeting, a resolution that the remuneration report to be adopted must be put to the shareholders. However, such a resolution is advisory only and does not bind the company or the directors of the company.

The remuneration report sets out the company's remuneration arrangements for the directors and senior management of the company. The remuneration report is part of the directors' report contained in the annual financial report of the company for a financial year.

The chair of the meeting must allow a reasonable opportunity for its shareholders to ask questions about or make comments on the remuneration report at the annual general meeting.

2.2 Voting consequences

A company is required to put to its shareholders a resolution proposing the calling of another meeting of shareholders to consider the appointment of directors of the company (**Spill Resolution**) if, at consecutive annual general meetings, at least 25% of the votes cast on a remuneration report resolution are voted against adoption of the remuneration report and at the first of those annual general meetings a Spill Resolution was not put to vote. If required, the Spill Resolution must be put to vote at the second of those annual general meetings.

If more than 50% of votes cast are in favour of the Spill Resolution, the company must convene a shareholder meeting (**Spill Meeting**) within 90 days of the second annual general meeting.

All of the directors of the company who were in office when the directors' report (as included in the company's annual financial report for the most recent financial year) was approved, other than the managing director of the company, will cease to hold office immediately before the end of the Spill Meeting but may stand for re-election at the Spill Meeting.

Following the Spill Meeting those persons whose election or re-election as directors of the company is approved will be the directors of the company.

2.3 Previous voting results

At the Company's previous annual general meeting the votes cast against the remuneration report considered at that annual general meeting were less than 25%. Accordingly, the Spill Resolution is not relevant for this Meeting.

3. RESOLUTION 2 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – GERD HOENICKE

3.1 General

Listing Rule 14.5 provides that an entity which has directors must hold an election of directors at each annual general meeting.

The Constitution sets out the requirements for determining which Directors are to retire by rotation at an annual general meeting.

Gerd Hoenicke, who has held office without re-election since 30 November 2023 and being eligible retires by rotation and seeks re-election.

Further information in relation Gerd Hoenicke is set out below.

Qualifications, experience and other material directorships	Mr Hoenicke is a recognised industry leader in facades and curtain wall systems – a senior level executive with more than 35 years of progressively responsible experience in the international facade industry. Mr Hoenicke has served as CEO of Gebrüder Schneider GmbH, a German facade contractor before he joined Seele GmbH in 2009 as its Technical Director. He has also served as Director - Consulting International Projects for Schüco International KG. Mr Hoenicke currently operates an independent building envelope consultancy that engages with architects and façade engineers on large construction projects in the US and Europe. Mr Hoenicke's impressive project portfolio includes the German Chancellery building in Berlin, Central St. Giles in London, EZB in Frankfurt, the Kimbell Art Museum in Dallas, 5 Broadgate in London and The Broad Museum in Los Angeles. Each of these and many other projects reflect his attention to detail in facade design and innovation. In 2019 Mr Hoenicke established his own facade consultancy business and where he has continued to be involved in various prestigious projects in the US and the UK including recently Parcel 9 in Washington DC and Landmark Pinnacle London.
Term of office	Gerd Hoenicke has served as a Director since 1 May 2023 and was elected on 30 November 2023.
Independence	If re-elected, the Board considers that Gerd Hoenicke will be an independent Director.
Board recommendation	Having received an acknowledgement from Gerd Hoenicke that he will have sufficient time to fulfil his responsibilities as a Director and having reviewed the performance of Mr Hoenicke since his appointment to the Board and the skills, knowledge, experience and capabilities required by the Board, the Directors (other than Gerd Hoenicke) recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of this Resolution.

3.2 Technical information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

If this Resolution is passed, Gerd Hoenicke will be re-elected to the Board as an independent Director.

If this Resolution is not passed, Gerd Hoenicke will not continue in his role as an independent Director. The Company may seek nominations or otherwise identify suitably qualified candidates to join the Company. As an additional consequence, this may detract from the Board and Company's ability to execute on its strategic vision.

4. RESOLUTION 3 – RATIFICATION OF PRIOR ISSUE OF CONSULTANCY SHARES

4.1 General

This Resolution seeks Shareholder ratification for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of 36,831 Shares to Deutsche Gesellschaft für Wertpapiersanalyse GMBH (**DGWA**) on 19 June 2024 in consideration for consulting services provided by DGWA.

The Shares were issued under a consulting and services agreement between the Company and DGWA (**Consultancy Agreement**). The material terms of the Consultancy Agreement are set out below:

Term	Initial period of twelve (12) months with ability to extend for additional periods of twelve (12) months.
Services	DGWA agreed to provide the Company with business development, investor awareness and media dissemination services.
Fees	The Company must pay to DGWA a fee of \$5,000 per month, payable 50% in cash and 50% in Shares (on a quarterly basis) based on the 15-day volume weighted average price of the Shares over the 15 trading days immediately prior to the start of each quarter.

The Consultancy Agreement otherwise contains terms and conditions standard for an agreement of its nature.

4.2 Listing Rule 7.1

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12 month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that 12 month period.

The issue does not fit within any of the exceptions set out in Listing Rule 7.2 and, as it has not yet been approved by Shareholders, it effectively uses up part of the 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1, reducing the Company's capacity to issue further equity securities without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1 for the 12 month period following the date of the issue.

4.3 Listing Rule 7.4

Listing Rule 7.4 allows the shareholders of a listed company to approve an issue of equity securities after it has been made or agreed to be made. If they do, the issue is taken to have been approved under Listing Rule 7.1 and so does not reduce the company's capacity to issue further equity securities without shareholder approval under that rule.

The Company wishes to retain as much flexibility as possible to issue additional equity securities in the future without having to obtain Shareholder approval for such issues under Listing Rule 7.1. Accordingly, the Company is seeking Shareholder ratification pursuant to Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue.

4.4 Technical information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

If this Resolution is passed, the issue will be excluded in calculating the Company's 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1, effectively increasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the date of the issue.

If this Resolution is not passed, the issue will be included in calculating the Company's 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1, effectively decreasing the number of equity securities that the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the date of the issue.

5. RESOLUTION 4 – APPROVAL OF 7.1A MANDATE

5.1 General

This Resolution seeks Shareholder approval by way of special resolution for the Company to have the additional 10% placement capacity provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A to issue Equity Securities without Shareholder approval.

A summary of Listing Rule 7.1 is set out in Section 4.2 above.

Under Listing Rule 7.1A, an Eligible Entity may seek shareholder approval by way of a special resolution passed at its annual general meeting to increase this 15% limit by an extra 10% to 25% (**7.1A Mandate**). The Company is an Eligible Entity.

5.2 Technical information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

For this Resolution to be passed, at least 75% of votes cast by Shareholders present and eligible to vote at the Meeting must be cast in favour of the Resolution.

If this Resolution is passed, the Company will be able to issue Equity Securities up to the combined 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A without any further Shareholder approval.

If this Resolution is not passed, the Company will not be able to access the additional 10% capacity to issue Equity Securities without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1A and will remain subject to the 15% limit on issuing Equity Securities without Shareholder approval set out in Listing Rule 7.1.

6. RESOLUTION 5 – ADOPTION OF EMPLOYEE INCENTIVE SECURITIES PLAN

6.1 General

This Resolution seeks Shareholder approval for purposes of Listing Rule 7.2 (Exception 13(b)) for the issue of a maximum of 15,000,000 Securities under the employee incentive scheme titled "Employee Incentive Securities Plan" (**Plan**).

The objective of the Plan is to attract, motivate and retain key employees, contractors and other persons who provide services to the Company, and the Company considers that the adoption of the Plan and the future issue of Securities under the Plan will provide these parties with the opportunity to participate in the future growth of the Company. While the Company has no immediate plans to issue Securities under the Plan, it is seeking Shareholder approval under Resolution 5 to be able to incentivise employees and contractors of the Company over the 3 year period following the Meeting.

A summary of Listing Rule 7.1 is set out in Section 4.2 above.

Listing Rule 7.2 (Exception 13(b)) provides that Listing Rule 7.1 does not apply to an issue of securities under an employee incentive scheme if, within three years before the date of issue of the securities, the holders of the entity's ordinary securities have approved the issue of equity securities under the scheme as exception to Listing Rule 7.1.

Exception 13(b) is only available if and to the extent that the number of equity securities issued under the scheme does not exceed the maximum number set out in the entity's notice of meeting dispatched to shareholders in respect of the meeting at which shareholder approval was obtained pursuant to Listing Rule 7.2 (Exception 13(b)). Exception 13(b) also ceases to be available if there is a material change to the terms of the scheme from those set out in the notice of meeting.

If this Resolution is passed, the Company will be able to issue Securities under the Plan to eligible participants over a period of 3 years. This Resolution is a special resolution which will enable the Company to repeal its existing Constitution and adopt a new constitution (**Proposed Constitution**) which is of the type required for a listed public company limited by shares updated to ensure it reflects the current provisions of the Corporations Act and Listing Rules.

Due to complexities with the solution design, there is no current go-live date. To ensure compliance with any replacement CHES system, clause 9.8 of the Proposed Constitution provides that the number of registered joint holders of securities shall be as permitted under the Listing Rules and the ASX Settlement Operating Rules.
Capital reductions (Clause 10.2)	The Proposed Constitution now permits sales of unmarketable parcels to a sale nominee(s) as part of a capital reduction.
