#### Tinancial Performance

During the half year ended 31 December 2024, investment income included net gain on financial instruments at fair value through profit or loss of \$16,246,000 (31 December 2023: \$2,419,000) and dividend income of \$182,000 (31 December 2023: \$357,000).

total expenses excluding income tax increased to \$1,517,000, an increase of \$478,000 from the corresponding period (31 December 2023: \$1,039,000), was due to performance fee accrued and an increase in management fees this period.

Net operating cash inflow was \$3,045,000 compared to an outflow of \$3,077,000 for the corresponding period. The main driver for the favourable movement was the proceeds from sales of investments were greater than the payments for investments.

#### Financial Position

The net assets increased by \$6,992,000 in this period to \$96,409,000 (30 June 2024: 89,238,000). This is attributable to an increase in portfolio value, partly offset by share buy backs and operating expenses.

The Directors submit their report on Salter Brothers Emerging Companies Limited ("the Company") for the half-year ended 31 December 2024.

#### **Directors**

#### **Dividends**

On 28 February 2025, the directors declared a fully franked interim dividend of \$0.02 per share to the holders of fully paid ordinary shares in respect of the half-year ended 31 December 2024, to be paid to shareholders on 24 April 2025. This dividend has not been included as a liability in these financial statements. The total estimated dividend to be paid is \$1.7 million

#### Review of operations

During the half year, the Company continued to operate within the terms of its investment mandate under the management of Salter Brothers Funds Management Pty Ltd ("the Manager").

The most appropriate measure of the Company's financial performance is profit after income tax expense. The profit after income tax expense for the half-year ended 31 December 2024 amounted to \$10,489,000 (31 December 2023: \$1,309,000). The Company's profit before tax for the half-year was \$14,950,000 (31 December 2023: \$1,761,000). Basic and diluted earnings per share after income tax was 11.80 cents for the half-year (31 December 2023: 1.42 cents).

The financial statements of Salter Brothers Emerging Companies Limited ("the Company") for the half-year ended 31 December 2024 were authorised for issue in accordance with a resolution of the Directors on 28 February 2025.

Salter Brothers Emerging Companies Limited is a listed public company (ASX code: SB2) limited by shares, incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

Salter Brothers Funds Management Pty Ltd, a corporate authorised representative of Salter Brothers Asset Management Pty Ltd, has been appointed to manage the Investment Portfolio for the Company.

#### Note 2. Material Accounting Policy Information

#### (2.1 Basis of Preparation

hese general purpose financial statements for the interim half-year reporting period ended 31 December 2024 have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standard AASB 134 Interim Financial Reporting and the Corporations Act 2001.

The financial report is presented in Australian dollars and all values are rounded to the nearest thousand (\$'000), except when therwise indicated under the option available to the Company under ASIC Corporations Instrument 2016/191 (Rounding in Financial/Directors' Reports). The Company is an entity to which this legislative instrument applies.

The interim report does not include all the notes of the type normally included in an annual financial report. Accordingly, this report is to be read in conjunction with the annual report for the year ended 30 June 2024 and any public announcements made by Salter Brothers Emerging Companies Limited during the interim reporting period in accordance with the continuous disclosure requirements of the *Corporations Act 2001*.

The statement of financial position is presented on a liquidity basis. Assets and liabilities are presented in decreasing order of liquidity and are not distinguished between current and non-current. All balances are generally expected to be recovered or settled within twelve months, except for investments in financial assets where the amount expected to be recovered within twelve months after the end of the reporting period cannot be reliably determined.

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the half-year financial report are consistent with those adopted and disclosed in the Company's 2024 annual financial report for the financial year ended 30 June 2024 except as discussed in Note 2.3 (a). The accounting policies are consistent with Australian Accounting Standards.

#### **Prior Year Comparatives**

Comparative information has been disclosed in respect of the previous period for amounts reported in the financial statements.

#### 2.2 Compliance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS)

#### Management agreement

The Company and the Manager have entered into the Management Agreement whereby, subject to the provisions set out below, the Company has exclusively appointed the Manager to invest and manage all of the assets of the Company (including any controlled entity of the Company) from time to time, for and on behalf of the Company (considered to be the provision of key management personnel services). An initial term of 10 years was entered into on 27 April 2021, which will be automatically extended for successive five year periods unless terminated earlier in accordance with the Management Agreement.

#### Management fees

In its capacity as Investment Manager, the Manager is entitled to be paid a management fee equal to 1.50% (plus GST) per annum of the value of the portfolio calculated on the last business day of each month and payable within 10 business days of the end of each month. Management fees remained payable (exclusive of GST) as at 31 December 2024 is \$135,928 (30 June 2024: \$105,000).

#### Performance fees

In addition, the Manager is entitled to be paid by the Company a fee equal to 20.00% (plus GST) of the Portfolio's outperformance, if any, over each performance calculation period, subject to a high watermark mechanism. Performance fees are calculated on the last business day of each Performance Period, and payable within 10 business days after the end of the relevant Performance Calculation Period. Performance fees remained payable (exclusive of GST) as at 31 December 2024 is \$379,878 (30 June 2024: \$Nil).

#### Shared services fees

Inder the terms of the Management Agreement, the Manager must provide or procure the provision of reasonable administrative support services reasonably required by the Company to conduct its business. The Manager may delegate the provision of such administrative support services. The Manager has entered into the Shared Services Agreement, under which Salter Brothers Asset Management Pty Ltd has agreed to provide to the Company the administrative support services. The Shared Services Fee will be paid to Salter Brothers Asset Management by the Manager, and the Company reimburses the Manager for the Shared Services Fee pursuant to the terms of the Management Agreement. Shared services fees remained payable (exclusive of GST) as at 31 December 2024 is \$Nil (30 June 2024: \$Nil).
