In addition to his broad functional experience in executive and management roles, Mr Hay's technical experience covers functions of minerals processing, project commissioning and the life cycle of capital works across various mineral commodities.

Principal Activities

The principal activities of the Company during the financial period were exploration programs in Western Australia and the Northern Territory, with the main focus on the wholly owned Aileron Niobium-REE-Copper project in the West Arunta region of Western Australia.

There were no significant changes in these activities during the half-year.

Review of Operations

The consolidated net loss after income tax for the half-year was \$2,748,136 (31 December 2024: \$2,098,668), including an expense of \$565,096 in respect of exploration costs expensed and written off (31 December 2024: \$597,194).

At the end of the half-year the Group had \$34,721,914 (30 June 2025: \$18,638,519) in cash and at call deposits. Capitalised mineral exploration and evaluation expenditure is \$37,399,389 (30 June 2025: \$30,612,089).

During the half-year the Company issued a total of 4,642,917 shares on the exercise of unlisted options at various prices. The Company issued 55,555,556 shares at \$0.45 per share pursuant to a share placement. Issues of shares during the period raised ~\$26.1 million, before issue costs.

Operations during the reporting period were primarily focused on exploration and study activities at the Company's Aileron Niobium-REE-Copper project in the West Arunta region of Western Australia, and copper exploration in the Northern Territory and Western Australia.

Note 1 Basis of preparation of half-year report

Statement of compliance

The half-year financial report is a general-purpose financial report prepared in accordance with the *Corporations Act 2001* and *AASB 134 Interim Financial Reporting*. Compliance with AASB 134 ensures compliance with International Financial Reporting Standard IAS 34 *Interim Financial Reporting*. The half-year report does not include notes of the type normally included in an annual financial report and shall be read in conjunction with the most recent annual financial report and any public announcements made by the Company during the interim period in accordance with the continuous disclosure requirements of the *Corporations Act 2001*. The Group is a for profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

Basis of preparation

The consolidated financial statements have been prepared on the basis of historical cost, except for the revaluation of certain non-current assets and financial instruments. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. All amounts are presented in Australian dollars, unless otherwise noted.

Other than as stated below, the accounting policies and methods of computation adopted in the preparation of the half-year financial report, are consistent with those adopted and disclosed in the Group's annual financial report for the year ended 30 June 2025.

These accounting policies are consistent with Australian Accounting Standards and with International Financial Reporting Standards.

New or amended Standards and Interpretations adopted

The Group has adopted all of the new or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period. No material change was required to the Group's accounting policies.

Any new or amended Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

Critical accounting estimates

Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that may have a financial impact on the Group and that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

Accounting for capitalised exploration and evaluation expenditure

There is some subjectivity involved in the carrying forward as capitalised or writing off to the Statement of Profit or Loss, exploration and evaluation expenditure. However, management give due consideration to areas of interest on a regular basis and are confident that decisions to either write off or carry forward such expenditure reflect fairly the prevailing situation.

Accounting for share-based payments

The values of amounts recognised in respect of share-based payments have been estimated based on the fair value of the equity instruments granted. Fair values of options issued are estimated by using an appropriate option pricing model. There are many variables and assumptions used as inputs into the models. If any of these assumptions or estimates were to change, this could have a significant effect on the amounts recognised.

Note 1 **Basis of preparation of half-year report (continued)**

Principles of consolidation

The financial statements of subsidiary companies are included in the consolidated financial statements from the date control commences until the date control ceases. The financial statements of subsidiary companies are prepared for the same reporting period as the parent company, using consistent accounting policies.

Inter-entity balances resulting from transactions with or between controlled entities are eliminated in full on consolidation. Investments in subsidiary companies are accounted for at cost in the individual financial statements of the Company.

The half-year financial report was approved by the Board of Directors on 10th March 2026.

Note 2 **Segment information**

The Group has identified its operating segments based on the internal reports that are reviewed and used by the board of Directors in assessing performance and determining the allocation of resources. Reportable segments disclosed are based on aggregating operating segments, where the segments have similar characteristics. The Group's sole activity is mineral exploration and resource development wholly within Australia, therefore it has aggregated all operating segments into the one reportable segment being mineral exploration.

The reportable segment is represented by the primary statements forming these financial statements.

Report on the Interim Consolidated Report

Conclusion


